On a very warm day, 29th April the Gleemen entertained the residents of Picton Court, and a good time was had by all.



On the 2nd May, the Gleemen were delighted to present a charity concert for Ty Hafan at The Riverboat, Caerau.





On the 8th May The Maesteg Gleemen sang at the Llangynwyd Village Hall for the 80th anniversary of VE Day celebrations. Fish and Chips suppers were provided by Emilia's Fish Bar in recognition of the role traditional British fish and chips shops played in helping to feed the nation during the war.





The Choir opened the evening's celebrations at the 1920s themed Mayor of Maesteg's Charity Ball on 17th May in our magnificently refurbished Maesteg Town Hall.







Every year the Maesteg Gleemen organise and present the Dunraven Welsh Singer of the Year in the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama. The competition started in 2003, and this year's event was held on 7th June, when, for the first time, the 19-31 year old class had joint winners, Erin Rossington, soprano, and Twm Tegid, baritone. At Cottrell Park, we helped family and friends of Clinton Harris celebrate his life at a memorial afternoon on the 21st of November 2025. This was a frosty but sunny day in a lovely setting for the occasion.





On 28th November, we performed at a concert for the friends of Bridgend Carers at Bethlehem Church Life Centre, Cefn Cribwr. We were joined by Delyth and Rhiannon, daughters of the late Huw Owen. Over £1000 was raised by the group during a wonderful evening of music making.



On 30th November, we performed in an annual and very poignant service for Loved and remembered babies in Swansea Minister Church.



Christmas Concert started at Tondu RFC on 5th December, swiftly followed by the Christmas tree lighting at Sarn Club on the 7th December.
